44. Golden Hours on Distant Location

(a) Travel time to be used in the computation of Golden Hours shall be subject to the following:

If travel time, with other than truck transportation as above provided in Paragraph 39(g), added to recesses (if any) immediately before and after such travel, totals less than eight (8) hours, such interval shall be deemed an "interruption" for the purposes of Golden Hours, but if such interval equals eight (8) or more hours, it shall be considered a "full daily rest period."

(b) The rate for Golden Hours, as defined in Paragraph 11(a)(1), for distant location employment shall be as follows:

(1) For such employment occurring on any day other than a holiday or the seventh day worked in an employee's workweek, two and one-half $(2\frac{1}{2})$ times the employee's scheduled Regular Basic Hourly Rate for all hours worked in excess of fourteen (14) consecutive hours (including meal periods) from the time of reporting for work and, effective February 13, 2022, three (3) times the scheduled Regular Basic Hourly Rate for all hours worked in excess of sixteen (16) consecutive hours.

(2) For such employment occurring on a holiday or the seventh day worked in the employee's workweek, five (5) times the employee's scheduled Regular Basic Hourly Rate for all hours worked in excess of fourteen (14) consecutive hours (including meal periods) from the time of reporting for work and, effective February 13, 2022, six (6)

times the scheduled Regular Basic Hourly Rate for all hours worked in excess of sixteen (16) consecutive hours.

(c) In addition, Paragraphs 11(b), (c) and (e), as modified in this Paragraph, shall apply.
